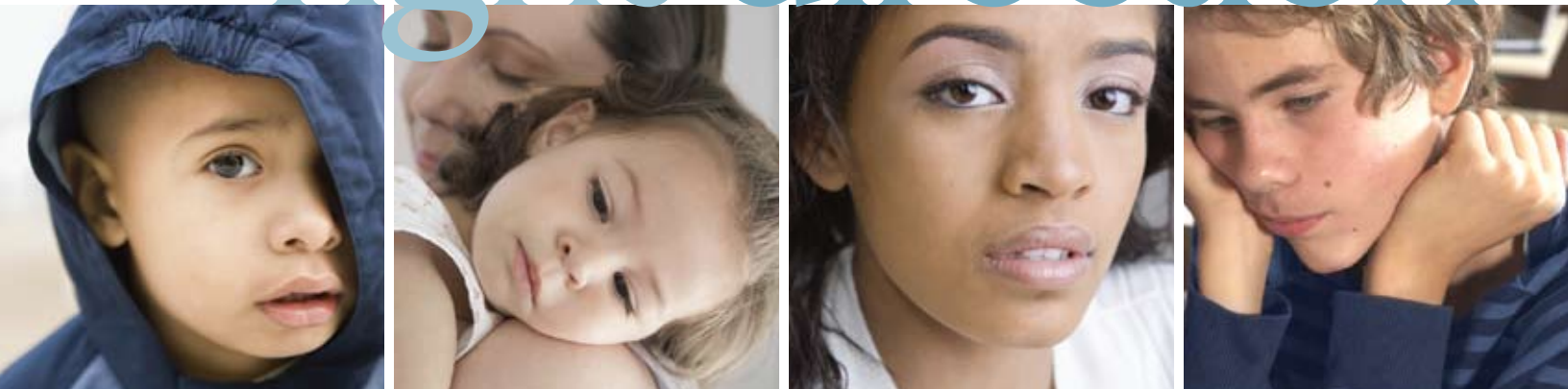

Gateway Healthcare is your link to behavioral health care, crisis intervention, emergency shelter, residential services and educational programs. We provide treatment, education and prevention services to Rhode Island's individuals and families in need, helping them to lead healthy lives in the community.

In fact, we are one of Rhode Island's largest nonprofit behavioral health care organizations, offering integrated treatment and prevention through residential, outpatient and community-based programs. We provide a comprehensive continuum of services 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. We are in more than 41 locations across Rhode Island including Pawtucket, Central Falls, Johnston, Cranston, Middletown, Lincoln, Smithfield, Woonsocket and West Greenwich.

Who is Gateway?

More than 700 dedicated staff and professionals including psychiatrists, psychologists, clinical specialists, nurses and case managers provide outstanding care through the programs you'll read about on the next pages. Our goal is to address our community's basic needs and evolve our programming as the community changes. The Gateway care continuum has grown to include affiliated non-profit organizations that offer specialized programming, thereby enhancing the array of services available to Rhode Islanders. Who Gateway serves.

We reach over 15,000 unduplicated men, women and children of all cultural and economic backgrounds throughout the state who would not otherwise have access to the services they need. Each year, we provide more than \$3 million in free care.

Children, Teens &



Adventures in Learning (AIL) utilizes experiential and adventure-based activities to create individualized learning opportunities that foster team building. Originally created to provide therapeutic adventure programs for children and adolescents suffering from emotional and behavioral disorders, the program has expanded to offer programming for adults, families and corporate groups.

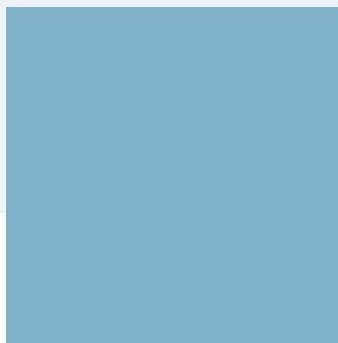
ASD Connections works in partnership with families, schools, physicians and other service providers to offer diagnostic and clinical services for children and youth with Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD). The program supports their emotional and social development through best practice therapies and case coordination services that are provided in the home and community settings. Occupational therapy, speech/language and behavior therapy professionals support the team in designing appropriate treatment interventions.

Child and Adolescent Residential Programs consist of a spectrum of programs ranging from semi-supervised apartment living to Acute Residential Treatment. The programs provide comprehensive mental health services, crisis intervention, treatment, care and housing for severely emotionally, sexually and physically abused and neglected children, youth and their families. The program is designed to reunify families, provide alternative treatment to hospitalization, and transition children and adolescents to alternative levels of care. Each residence is a therapeutic environment where treatment begins. While the youth and family develop new skills and communication avenues, the team partners with them to expand their progress and transfer skills into their home, school and community.

Child & Family Community Treatment Services provide community-based, family-oriented intensive therapies and care coordination for children in need of clinical services through a continuum of programming including CAITS, EOS and other home-based services. Our specialized teams include interventions for grief, trauma, substance abuse, depression, anxiety, juvenile justice, parent/child relations, oppositional defiant behaviors, autism spectrum disorders and other behavioral health disorders.

Empowered Families CEDARR Center offers a direct link to care that fits the needs of children and families coping with special needs, behavioral health issues, developmental disabilities, medical disorders, autism and technology dependence. They also provide assessment, referrals, resources and therapeutic intervention for the short term to address the needs of families.

Family Outpatient Counseling provides therapy and psychiatric services to children, adolescents, adults and families throughout Gateway programs, co-located community social service agencies and primary care centers.



Families



Kid's Link RI is the state's first centralized emergency hotline for children in emotional crisis and suffering from behavioral problems or mental health issues. The hotline: **1-866-429-3979** connects parents and caregivers to all the children's services in the state, and helps parents determine the best place to go for treatment.

Youth Guidance provides school-based services to children during the school day and after school through contracts with local school districts and grant funding. Staff provide support to help youth from elementary through high school build the personal skills needed to prevent social problems while teaching, practicing and internalizing the behaviors that make young people successful at school, at home and in the community.

Valley Community School is an alternative school for children and youth with special needs where highly trained teachers and professionals help them overcome behavior problems through small classroom settings, tailored educational plans, vocational preparation, specialized counseling and structured learning. In addition, VCS provides support through its placement of Behavior Technicians who serve in classrooms in the Providence and Pawtucket public schools.

Adults



Crisis/Emergency Services deliver around-the-clock emergency services, assessment and crisis intervention. Gateway's Crisis/Emergency Services are also linked to a national network for suicide prevention and intervention.

Rhode Island System of Care is a multidisciplinary program that provides a comprehensive range of psychiatric, rehabilitative, case management and supportive interventions to individuals with severe and persistent mental illness. The program helps individuals to live healthy, safe and independent lives in their own community environments. Services include: daily living skills; nursing services; rehabilitative services; assistance accessing community resources; referrals to internal resources; crisis intervention; and counseling.

Vocational and Psychosocial Rehabilitative Services provide supported employment and education, as well as community integration activities such as social network development and group activities for people living with mental health issues.

Residential Programs for Adults offer housing and mental health services to adults with co-occurring and persistent mental health issues in long-term, transitional or semi-independent settings.

LifeWatch Employee Assistance Program provides assessments, referrals, solution-focused short-term treatment, coaching, training, consultation and crisis intervention services to all levels of staff within local and regional companies.

Gateway Professional Group is a private group that provides individual, marital and family psychotherapy to men, women and children on an outpatient basis. Various treatment approaches are utilized to meet the needs of each individual.

Substance Abuse



Tri-Hab helps individuals with substance abuse and co-occurring mental health problems through a series of residential and outpatient programs addressing the many issues related to drug and alcohol abuse. Treatment includes group and individual therapies, education, outreach, crisis intervention, assessment, case management and linkages to primary health care.

Substance Abuse Residential Treatment Programs offer comprehensive treatment through individual and group counseling, case management, psychiatric evaluations and linkages to primary health care. Services are provided at two locations for men and women with substance abuse and co-occurring mental health problems.

Women's Day Treatment provides intensive daily substance abuse treatment through a variety of group treatment sessions. The program focuses on the particular needs of women who have a safe and stable living arrangement in place, but need more intensive services than outpatient can offer. The program offers daily lunches and arrangements for child care. Linkages to psychiatric and primary health care services are available.

Outpatient Counseling offers substance abuse education, assessment, outreach, crisis intervention and case management, as well as individual, family and group substance abuse counseling, mental health evaluations and treatment. Linkages to psychiatric and primary health care services are available.

Transitional Housing provides individuals completing a substance abuse treatment program a safe and substance-free living environment. Andrea's Hope is a recovery home with four apartments for women with children. Norfolk House is a home for women without children. Barton Street is a 10-bed residence for men. Lengths of stay are limited to two years with the maintenance of sobriety and being drug-free required.

Centro La Familia provides the Latino population with culturally-sensitive counseling, substance abuse services and treatment for co-occurring substance abuse and mental health problems.

Domestic Violence Batterers Program provides male and female offenders of domestic violence crimes with educational group sessions to identify and resolve anger management issues. Individuals are referred by the court and local probation officers in each region of the state.
